PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Fairview has been put to bed for the winter. It looks pretty good after a final mowing and trimming with hoses rolled up and stored and irrigation systems turned off to prevent freezing and breaking. Maintenance for the winter months will primarily consist of trying to keep the grounds clear of the abundant trash which blows into the cemetery. Eleven of our 150-plus new trees were replaced this summer by the landscapers--7 of them on the now-expired maintenance contract--and we'll find out in the Spring how they survived what is forecasted to be a very dry winter in Santa Fe.

But, a committee of board members Rhonda Paynter, David Mason, John Barker, Jean Eddy, and Erik Mason has been appointed to develop and prioritize both short term and long term goals for Fairview. Considerations include but are not limited to ascertaining ways to water the new trees during the winter, improvement of the irrigation wells of the trees, plastering the information kiosk and installing a sign on it, completion of the area for cremains so that it can be advertised with the mortuaries, an effective (and possibly very expensive) plan for prairie dog control, leveling/raising headstones, and planting the cemetery, section by section, with a native grass such as blue gramma which does not need water once established. We have received, just a few days ago, a significant donation from an Association member in Texas for grass seed.

Fairview's prairie dog situation hit the front page headlines of *The New Mexican* in June, followed by a flurry of letters, often quite funny, to the editor with both "protectionist" and "pesky rodent" opinions. The problem has only increased, even after we paid \$10,000 several years ago to have them relocated, an expense we most definitely cannot continue to afford. One of our board members tripped in a hole just this past week!

Our Annual Workday/Annual Meeting in May was a success, and board members and officers were elected as shown at the end of this newsletter. Contact any of them if you have any ideas or suggestions for the cemetery. Both at this meeting and at subsequent board meetings, we have discussed the need for diversification and "new blood" on the board. Most of us are in the "Social Security" era of our lives—some have been in this status for many years!—and we need more young people to bring fresh ideas to the table and to insure the preservation of Fairview for years to come. We, in effect, need your children! Our Nominating Committee consists of Stephen Hughes, David Mason, Ron & Jean Ball, and Joanne Legits, all of whose telephone numbers are listed on this newsletter. They would be glad to hear from anyone who has suggestions for board

members (three of whose 3-year terms expire next May) and officers. We particularly need a new treasurer, because Joanne's health does not permit her to continue the invaluable contribution she has made to Fairview over many years. And our president is most definitely slowing down.

May 14th has been selected for next year's Annual Workday/Annual Meeting. Put the date on your new 2011 calendars now!

Fairview's "residents" 100 years ago, from the *New Mexican*

February 9, 1905. *The death at Las Animas, Colo., on January 20 of John MacGillivray moves the Estancia Herald to tell the story of the five MacGillivray brothers, Finlay, Angus [died 1917 at age 51], Duncan, John and Allan [died 1922 at age 42], who came, all except Finlay, to the Estancia Valley from Inverness, Scotland, years ago. The MacGillivray family is represented on the Fairview Board by descendant Lucy Dix.*

A recent article in *The New Mexican* about our fiestas and our 400th anniversary highlighted two residents of Fairview:

Lawyer, legislator, writer and mayor **Amado Chaves Sr.**, who died in 1930 at age 70, was described as a "live wire" in his obituary. His descendant and past Board member of Fairview, Amado Summers, still keeps us on our toes.

Dr. Marion Hotopp, who died in 1976 at age 75, took on a 1946 *Time* magazine article denigrating New Mexico's infant mortality rate and spent more than two decades working to improve the mortality rate of infants in rural areas.

And **Marian and Abe Silver, Jr.** were yet again recognized for their numerous services to our community when they were presented with the Governor's 2010 Award for Excellence in the Arts. Among their many works have been the Opera, the Museum Foundation, St Vincent's Hospital, and the Boys & Girls Club. Truly Living Treasurers!

Recent Burials.

At the request of his mother, **Richard Craig Hanson**, who died in 1958 at the age of five, was disinterred in June to be interred with his parents at the National Cemetery.

Longtime Santa Fean Kitty Jones Nesbit died on 7 Aug 2010 at age 95 and was buried with her husband Gordon Jones and her two daughters Pat & Jeri. Kitty was secretary of St John's United Methodist Church for over three decades. She is survived by her granddaughter Lori Jameson of Albuquerque and grandson Richard Owens of Austin TX.

UNMARKED GRAVE? Approximately 1,500 of the 3,500 graves at Fairview remain unmarked! We will coordinate marking graves with flat granite headstones with a text including name, dates of birth and death, and a short sentiment of 2-3 words. Albuquerque Monument has recently almost doubled the prices for these headstones, and the standard size of 12" x 24" now costs us \$500, including installation, which is still considerably below the retail price. Call Erik Mason (505) 982-1258 to make arrangements for these stones. And remember, Fairview now again permits installation of upright headstones, one of the great visual delights of the cemetery.


